3. **Billecart-Salmon Reserve, Brut N.V.**

**HALF BOTTLE**

*Straw coloured with a persistent mousse, a nose of ripe pear with touches of cut hay, this champagne is full of fruit, fresh and long lasting.*



4. **Charles-le-Bel, Champagne de la Couronne, Brut N.V.**

*After 150 years in family ownership, Billecart's quality and reputation balance beautifully with our belief that the best raw materials, handled professionally in a sympathetic and sensitive manner, produce the purest flavour.*

5. **Louis Roederer, Brut Premier, Reims N.V.**

*This well known and respected Grand Marque Champagne House produces this rich, soft, elegant and creamy with wonderful biscuity finish.*

6. **ROSÉ - Billecart-Salmon, Mareuil-Sur-Ay N.V.**

*Salmon pink with pronounced nose of blackcurrant and strawberry fruit. Balanced taste, fresh on the palate with fine, long-lasting bubbles and a crisp finish.*

7. **The “Cristal”, Louis Roederer, Vintage 1999**

*This cuvee is considered today as being the culmination of Louis Roederer's quest for perfection. In 1876 Tsar Alexander 11 demanded that his personal cuvee be presented in inimitable crystal bottles. The result is recognised today as the ultimate Champagne. Made only from the finest vintage wines, Cristal regularly realises the highest auction prices achieved by champagne.*

## White Wine

### Australia

8. **Red Earth Chardonnay, South Eastern Australia 2004**  
*Left unwooded to highlight its own natural zesty citrus peach and ripe melon flavours. Fresh and crisp on the finish with a touch of dried pear. The real Oz chardonnay.*
9. **Sauvignon Blanc, Ceravolo Estate, Adelaide Plains, Australia 2004**  
*Bottled young to capture its vibrant fresh style – leafy and herbaceous aromas with a zesty palate of limes, lychees and green apples made for immediate enjoyment to enhance all manor of lightly spiced foods, seafoods and salads or ideal as an aperitif.*

### Chile

10. **Chardonnay Reserve, Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, Chile 2004**  
*Fresh and full with apple, ripe pear and tropical fruit notes. The toasty notes from the maturing cask give this wine a complexity that make drinking it an unforgettable experience.*

### France

11. **Pinot Blanc, Hugel & Fils, Alsace 2003**  
*Ripe, juicy melons with a hint of spice. Refreshing acidity. A perfect all-rounder. Alsace wines are always so clean and fresh to the taste.*
12. **Gewurztraminer, Hugel, Alsace, France 2004**  
*Lovely deep golden colour, intense aroma of flowers and lychees, lusciously rich and powerful - they say there are only two types of people who drink Alsace wine: one, those in the know or two, those in the wine trade.*
13. **Pouilly Fume "La Loge Aux Moines" Patrice Moreux, Loire, France 2004**  
*Small family owned estate showing their skills by pinpointing the highlights of this noble Sauvignon Blanc grape. Fresh and full with gooseberries and a touch on smoke on the nose. Apple palate and more fresh gooseberries.*
14. **Sancerre, Chateau de Thauveney, Loire, France 2004**  
*This is an excellent vintage, exhibiting superb greengage and gooseberry fruit with a very fresh, green finish – lovely.*
15. **Chablis 1er Cru Vaillons, Louis Michel, Burgundy, France 2003**  
*From arguably one of the top Chablis producers using totally traditional methods, this mouth-filling wine displays wonderfully powerful aromas and rich, flinty peachy flavours.*
16. **Chassagne-Montrachet, Les Benoitites, Chartron et Trebuchet, Burgundy, France 2002**  
*A fabulous Cotes de Beaune Blanc, left on the lees for ten months to produce this intense fresh mineral style with notes of dried fruit, lime, pear and a hint of vanilla and spice.*

## Italy

**17. Pinot Grigio, La Casada Piave, Italy 2005**

*In the right hands, the Pinot Grigio has great charm and character - this wine is an excellent example - wonderful cream soda nose, crisp, lively acidity backed by classic flavours of melon, peach kernels and a slightly spicy finish - very versatile, can accompany any fish or white meats.*

**18. Gavi D.O.C. "Terrarossa" La Zerba, Italy 2003**

*It is wonderfully scented showing lots of honeysuckle, peach and pear. On the palate it is rich and almost creamy with yet more pear, guava, melon and honeyed fruit. The finish is super complex and elegant.*

## New Zealand

**19. Francesca Bay, Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand 2005**

*Intense flavours of gooseberry, passion fruit, citrus and stone fruit are exhibited with slight perfumed and floral notes, which add complexity. Long on the finish with a crisp mineral and lime.*

**20. Lawson's Dry Hills, Riesling 2004**

*Subtle peach and melon aromas are balanced with lifted citrus flavours and a clean fresh finish.*

**21. Mount Vernon, Unoaked Chardonnay, New Zealand 2004**

*French Chardonnay at this price is often too light, yet Australian too rich. Marlborough may provide the perfect pitch. Mount Vernon's has an engaging flavour of white peaches, the merest hint of creaminess and a crisp, refreshing finish. A highly satisfying wine, which will never tire the palate.*

## South Africa

**22. The Veldt Range, Chenin Blanc, Robertson Valley, South Africa 2005**

*This Chenin Blanc has the classic appeal of South Africa's most successful white grape - fresh, clean zesty acidity with elegant fruit: melons, lemons and lychees.*

**23. Sauvignon Blanc, Veldt Range, South Africa 2005**

*Savour the spectrum of varietal flavours that personifies our Sauvignon Blanc. Both the palate and the nose are dominated by rich, gooseberry and greengage fruits backed by a herbaceous crispness.*

**Rosé****24. ROSE Rioja, Bodegas Campillo, Spain 2005**

*An extra fruity and aromatic fairly dry rosé redolent of raspberries and strawberries.  
So refreshing.*

**25. Sancerre Rosé, Domaine Hubert Brochard, France 2004**

*Think strawberries and raspberries in a glass and you need go no further! The quintessential  
Rosé – delicate yet pronounced, summer red fruits with a lovely, fresh, clean finish.*

## Australia

26. **Shiraz, Jacobite Ridge, South Australia, Australia, 2003**  
*A richly coloured wine; velvety in the glass, exuding ripe, plummy fruit bursting with mocha leather, black pepper and oak.*
27. **Red Earth, Merlot, Australia 2003**  
*Vibrant rich crimson with strawberry, mulberry and blackberry fruit with a touch of spicy oak. Soft and sassy.*
28. **Shiraz, Fonty's Pool, Pemberton, Western Australia 2002**  
*A partnership between the Weymss family from Fife and David Hohnan of Cloudy Bay fame. Stylish, sophisticated, full red berry and black chocolate experience. A really rewarding mouthful.*
29. **Pinot Noir, Fonty's Pool, Pemberton Western Australia 2003**  
*Unusual from Australia but this is a fine Pinot Noir with typical raspberry fruit and an earth character beginning to show through.*
30. **Merlot, St Andrews Estate, Adelaide Plains, South Australia 2001**  
*Vibrant deep red, the moderately fragrant bouquet has a mix of spicy fruit and oak aroma leading to a palate offering ripe red fruits. A serious wine. Keeps winning awards. Serious Red.*

## California

31. **Zinnia Zinfandel, California 2003**  
*A wonderful brooding, deep dark purple colour, an explosive aroma of wild blackberries and cherries complimented on the palate by a soft, velvety, distinguished sensation, a powerful wine yet still elegant and restrained.*
32. **Cabernet Sauvignon, Pedroncelli, California 2002**  
*Well balanced Cabernet made to emphasise the fruit. Raspberry, cassis flavours join nicely with the soft toasted oak. The Merlot is to give softness and suppleness. It is medium bodied in style.*

## Chile

33. **Cabernet Sauvignon Reserva, Santa Ema , Maipo Valley, Chile 2003**  
*Plums and velvety notes from mature tannins give this wine a varietal character that combines perfectly with the vanilla, toasty wood of maturation. A wine of great structure and complexity.*

**France****34. Merlot, Domaine Galetis, Vin de Pays d'Oc, France 2003**

*Excellent fruit extraction producing a powerful, plummy aroma and taste with a soft supple rounded flavours and a medium finish.*

**35. Cotes du Rhone, Parallèle 45, Paul Jaboulet Aine, Rhone, France 2003**

*Concentrated, warm palate, with the blackcurrant and pepper characteristics of Syrah combining well with the softer flavours of Grenache. A remarkable wine for the appellation which will compliment roasted meats, game and cheese.*

**36.. Fleurie, Domaine Fontabon, Cru Beaujolais, France 2004**

*Classic Beaujolais by a superlative producer, this Gamay shows rich, soft, wild berry fruit with a long elegant finish and has enough weight to suit game dishes and any red meats.*

**37. Chateau La Fleur Chantecaille, St Emilion, Bordeaux 1999**

*Produced from 70% Merlot and 30% Cabernet this is rich and mature on the nose with a full-bodied, blackcurrant dominated palate.*

**38. Chorey-les-Beaune, Joseph Drouhin, Burgundy, France 2003**

*Dark red with a powerful nose. Good structure, rich, elegant and well balanced with a very fine finish picking up flavours of liquorice. Perfect with red meat and game.*

**39. Chateauneuf du Pape, Domaine de la Millière 2001**

*La Millière is a family domaine of 27 hectares run by the fifth generation of the Arnaud family. Current owner Michel is utterly dedicated to producing top quality wines and has devised a unique fermentation method, which remains a closely guarded secret. Some of the vineyards date back to before the 1<sup>st</sup> World War and virtually all are over 25 years old.*

**40. Chateau de Pez, St Estephe, Bordeaux, France 2001**

*The 1999 possesses good colour, a sweet, jammy, blackcurrant aroma, well proportioned and concentrated feel on the palate, low acidity and mature tannin on the finish. This tasty, mouth-filling St Estephe should last for a decade." Robert Parker.*

**41. Gevrey Chambertain, Drouhin, France 2000**

*Dark red with a powerful nose. Good structure, rich, elegant and well balanced with a very fine finish picking up flavours of liquorice.*

**42. Cote Rotie, Brune et Blonde, J. Vidal Fleury, Rhone, France 2000**

*This is 95% Syrah, 5% Viognier, matured for two years in barrels, a third of which are new. The nose shows ripe, rounded caramel-tinged berry fruit. There's savoury, slightly meaty fruit on the palate. Good concentration, fine grained tannins and a dry finish.*

**43. Chateau Rauzan Ségla, Margaux, France 2001**

*A lovely floral nose. Good depth and richness. Blackcurrant/orange zest. A rich powerful palate. Well-structured. Lovely approachable Segla. Very fine.*

**44. Clos de Vougeout, Grand Cru, Joseph Drouhin Burgundy, France 1999**

*Sweet, spicy, red berry aromas, a foursquare tangy style with red and blackcurrant flavours. Rich and toasty with a long finish.*

**45. Hermitage La Chapelle, Paul Jaboulet, Rhone, France 1999**

*Considered one of the greatest red wines of France, it has a dense, purple black colour and a concentrated aroma and flavour of blackcurrants and wild blackberries.*

## Italy

46. **Sangiovese Marche, Fattorie Moratico, Italy**  
*Intense floral scents with aromas of fruit and spice. Ruby red with purple reflections. Vibrant red fruit and cedar notes which finishes softly on the palate.*
47. **Valpolicella Superiore, "Ripasso" DOC Veneto 2002**  
*Huge fruit, blackberries, stewed figs, spice, herbs and morello cherries with a nicely concentrated palate and a lovely expansive finish. The maturation takes place in both cherry wood and oak barrels for 24 months.*
48. **Nebbiolo Langhe Giuseppe Mascarello 2001**  
*The 2001 Nebbiolo is an excellent example of Nebbiolo to be drunk young with its cherry and strawberry fruit, floral fragrance, light-grained tannins, and fine freshness. It is, nonetheless, a wine which will easily last another 3-4 years.*
49. **Barolo "Villero" Giuseppe Mascarello, Italy 1998**  
*The colour is reminiscent of aged Burgundy showing light brown edges but with a deeper purple centre. The nose and palate show abundant tar, roast meat, fresh prune, vanilla, truffle, with light chocolate. Leave this in the glass for 10 minutes and it just gets better and better.*

## New Zealand

50. **Francesca Bay, Pinot Noir, Marlborough, New Zealand 2004**  
*Medium bodied with fine, soft tannins, sweet cherry fruit and a warm finish.*
51. **Merlot Malbec, La Strada, Fromm, New Zealand 2002**  
*Merlot provides stone fruit flavours and Malbec colour and depth to this benchmark Fromm cuvée. Mellow tannins and a long finish make for a wine to relish with beef or lamb.*

## South Africa

52. **Reyneke Cornerstone, Stellenbosch, South Africa 2001 (Bio Dinamic & Organic)**  
*Aged in 35% new oak with the rest in 2nd use this blend of Cabernet Sauvignon (48%) Merlot (26%) and Shiraz (26%) is showing really nicely now. Deep plum in colour with ripe red berry and cherry fruits, spice, some cassis and even brambles, backed by a touch more spice and softness.*
53. **Pinotage, Martin Meinert, Devon Valley, South Africa 2004**  
*Deep purple in colour showing scents of mulberry, blackberry, and even cassis. The palate is full of pepper, spice, blackberry, more cassis and big, but ripe tannins. The finish is well-structured, with good length. Meaty - well made Pinotage!*
54. **Reyneke Reserve, Stellenbosch, South Africa 2001 (Bio Dinamic & Organic)**  
*40% of this blend of 82% Shiraz, 14% Merlot and 4% Cabernet is aged in new French oak for 13 months before bottling. The result is truly amazing. It is inky black in colour with black, spicy fruits, cloves, chunky ripe blackberries and more spice on the palate and nice, toasty oak in the finish.*

Spain

55. **Campillo Crianza, Rioja, Spain 2000**  
*Deep, complex aromas with very developed flavours of fruit, leather and vanilla. On the palate, it is powerful and full-bodied with a well-balanced tannic flavour on the finish.*
56. **Campillo Rioja Reserva, Rioja, Spain 1998**  
*Fruity aromas perfectly assembled with oak. Elegant and sumptuous palate with a marvellous tannic balance giving a unique and distinctive character.*
57. **Ribera Del Duero, Gran Reserva, Bodegas Valduero Spain 1995**  
*A big wine . Elegant. Great diversity of aromas, leather, tobacco with a slightly minty finish. Aged in six different types of barrels which gives the wine amazing character and depth.*

Dessert Wine

58. **Late Harvest Furmint Domaine de Disznoko Tokaji 2003** **Half Litre**  
*A fruity aroma with honey, banana, William's pear and wild flower features. Its perfectly harmonise with its soft sweetness giving the wine intense flavours aromas.*

Port Wines

59. **Quinta do Noval LB** **Bottle**  
*Soft, sweet and uncomplicated with lovely fresh dark red berry characteristics.* **Half Bottle**  
**50ml glass**
60. **Old Tawny Vintage Port, Quinta do Noval 'Colheita' 1986** **Half Bottle**  
*Mellow spicy complex from prolonged aging in casks. A beautifully rounded glass of Port.*

Half BottlesWhite Wine

61. **Chardonnay, Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, Chile 2004**  
*A perfect balance of tropical fruits make this a fresh, full wine with a long, pleasant finish. An elegant, complex wine with light notes of toast and vanilla.*

Red Wine

62. **Cabernet Sauvignon, Santa Ema, Maipo Valley, Chile 2004**  
*Absolutely jam packed with loads of blackcurrant fruit bursting out - beautifully rich wine.*
